PROPHET MUHAMMAD'S (SAWW) LIFE

Prophet MUHAMMAD (ﷺ), the final Prophet of Islam, was born in 570 CE in Makkah into the noble Quraysh tribe. Orphaned at a young age, he was raised with compassion and dignity by his grandfather and later his uncle. Known as Al-Amin (the Trustworthy) even before prophethood, he was admired for his honesty, fairness, and gentle character.

At the age of 40, he received the first revelation through Angel Jibrael (A.S.), marking the beginning of his mission to guide humanity towards faith, justice, and moral excellence. Despite facing severe opposition in Makkah, he continued preaching patience, unity, and the worship of one and only ALLAH SUBHANAHU WA TA ' ALA.

After migrating to Madinah, he established a peaceful, just, and inclusive society based on equality, mutual respect, and the rights of all individuals. His teachings emphasized kindness, humility, charity, and good character. Through his wisdom and leadership, Islam spread with harmony and compassion.

Prophet MUHAMMAD (ﷺ) returned to Makkah peacefully, forgave even his former enemies. He passed away in 632 CE, leaving behind the Qur'an and Sunnah as complete guidance for all mankind. His life remains the perfect example of mercy, justice, and noble character.

COMPANIONS OF PROPHET MUHAMMAD ﷺ

HAZRAT ABU BAKR SIDDIQ (R.A.)

The closest friend and first adult male to accept Islam, Hazrat Abu Bakr (R.A.) supported the Prophet (ﷺ) with unwavering faith. He stood by him during the Hijrah and dedicated his wealth and strength to Islam. After the Prophet's (ﷺ) passing, he became the first Caliph, preserving unity and protecting the Muslim Ummah. His life reflects honesty, sacrifice, and firm belief.

HAZRAT UMAR FAROOQ (R.A.)

Known for his justice and courage, Hazrat Umar (R.A.) accepted Islam through a profound change of heart that strengthened the early Muslim community. As the second Caliph, he established systems of governance, justice, and public welfare that shaped the Islamic state. His leadership was marked by fairness, humility, and deep love for the Prophet (ﷺ).

HAZRAT USMAN GHANI (R.A.)

A man of exceptional modesty and generosity, Hazrat Usman (R.A.) was twice married to the Prophet's (ﷺ) daughters, earning the title Dhun-Nurayn (The Possessor of Two Lights). He devoted his wealth to help Muslims and expanded the Islamic state peacefully. He is renowned for compiling the standard written Qur'an, ensuring its preservation for all generations.

HAZRAT ALI IBN ABI TALIB (R.A.)

Hazrat Ali (R.A.) was the cousin and the son-in-law of the Prophet (ﷺ) and was one of the earliest believers in Islam. He was renowned for his bravery, wisdom, and strong sense of justice. As the fourth Caliph of Islam, he led the Muslim Ummah with patience, humility, and courage during difficult times. His life reflects devotion to ALLAH SUBHANAHU WA TA'ALA, love for the Prophet (ﷺ), and loyalty to Islam.

JALSA SEERAT-UN-NABI SAWW

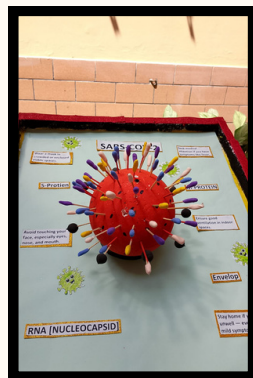

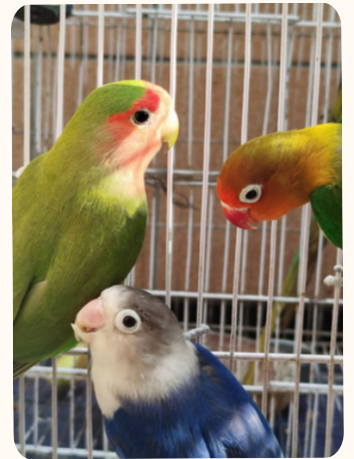


ANNUAL EXHIBITION 2025

انسان کو اللہ تعالیٰ نے بے شمار نعمتیں عطا فرمائی ہیں۔ انہی نعمتوں میں سے خوشبو بھی ایک اہم نعمت ہے۔ خوشبو انسان کے مزاج کو خوشگوار کرتی ہے اور دل و دماغ کو تازگی بخشتی ہے۔ انسان ہمیشہ خوشبودار چیزوں کی طرف مائل ہوتا ہے، خصوصاً عبادات اور مذہبی مواقع پر خوشبو کا استعمال دل کو سکون اور روح کو پاکیزگی عطا کرتا ہے۔ اسلام میں بھی خوشبو کو نہایت اہمیت دی گئی ہے۔

عنبر ایک اور قیمتی خوشبو ہے جو سمندر میں پائے جانے والے ایک خاص جانور (whale) سے حاصل ہوتی ہے۔ عنبر کی خوشبو گرم، منفرد اور نہایت دلکش ہوتی ہے۔ اسے اعلیٰ درجے کے عطریات اور خوشبو بنانے میں استعمال کیا جاتا ہے۔ صوفیاء کے ہاں بھی عنبر کو خاص روحانی اور ذہنی لطافت کے لیے اہم سمجھا جاتا ہے۔

اسلام خوشبو، صفائی اور نفاست کو بہت اہمیت دیتا ہے۔ خوشبو نہ صرف انسان کی ظاہری شخصیت کو نکھارتی ہے بلکہ اس کے باطن پر بھی مثبت اثر ڈالتی ہے۔ مشک اور عنبر جیسی خوشبودار چیزیں نہ صرف اسلامی تہذیب و ثقافت میں بلکہ انسانی شخصیت کی خوبصورتی، وقار اور حسن میں بھی نمایاں مقام رکھتی ہیں۔

A Thousand Splendid Suns
